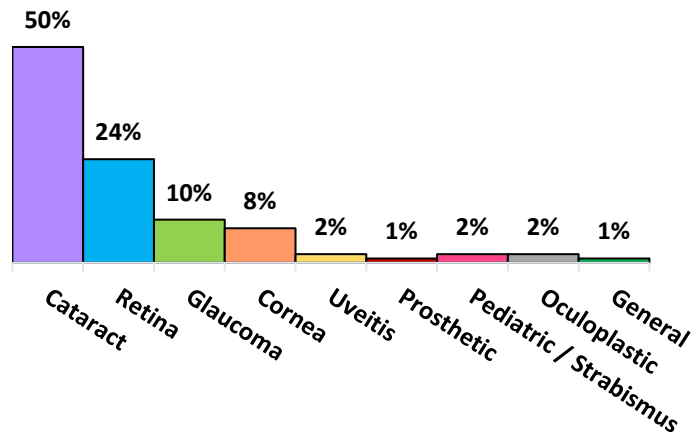

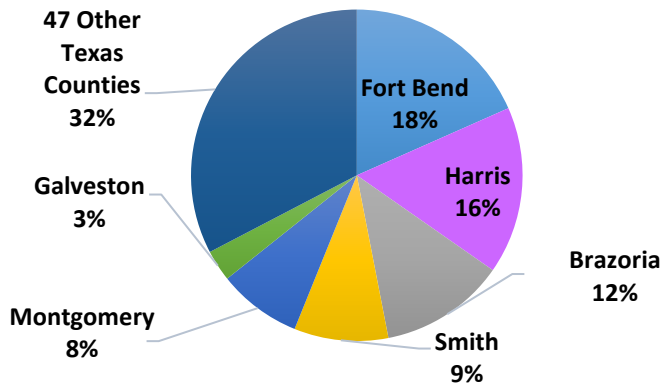

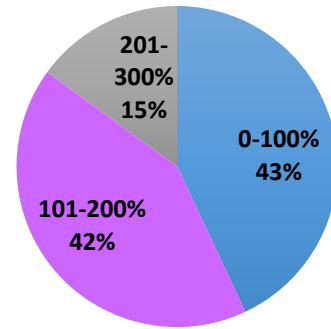

County of Residence



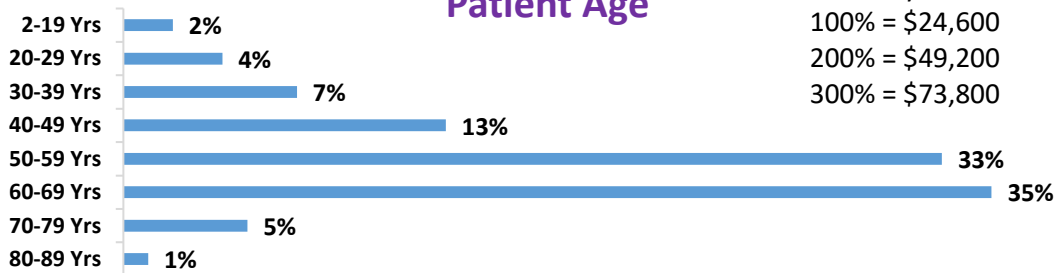
2017 Federal Poverty Level



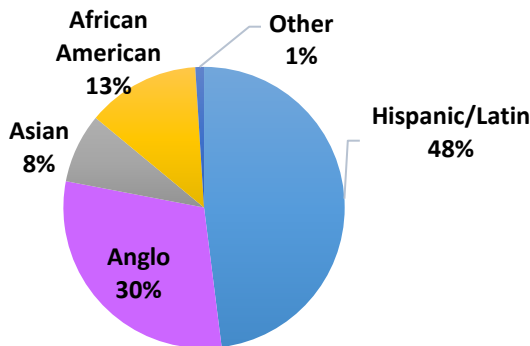
2017 Federal Poverty Level

 300% = \$73,800

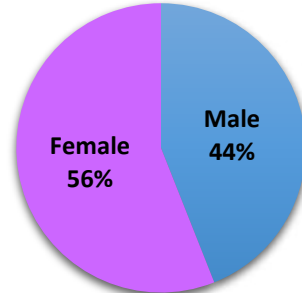
Patient Age

Supported solely by the charitable donations of individuals, private foundations, corporations, annual fundraising events, and donated time and services by the physicians and partnering medical professionals, HEAF has successfully treated thousands of patients since 1981.

What Makes HEAF Unique? HEAF serves as a last resort organization for adults and children that have no other resources to receive the eye care services they need. HEAF is the only 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in Texas that provides complete medical and surgical eye care services at no cost to the patient.
